Thursday, 28 July

The final day of the relay will start at Birmingham Children's Hospital, weaving its way through a number of neighbourhoods. It will be taking in more parks and open spaces as well as the Jewellery Quarter, which contributed to the creation of the Baton.

Later, it will pass landmarks including the Nishkam Centre in Soho Road, Perry Hall Park, Sutton Coldfield town centre and Aston Villa's home Villa Park.

It will then head on to Aston Hall and from there, it will then be taken into the Alexander Stadium as part of the Opening Ceremony for the Games.
